HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 19A of the Chattels Transfer Act 1924, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Chattels Transfer Fees Regulations 1991, Amendment No. 1, and shall read together with and deemed part of the Chattels Transfer Fees Regulations 1991* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
 - (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1992.
- 2. Fees increased—The Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended—
 - (a) By omitting the expression "10.00", and substituting the expression "11.00"; and
 - (b) By omitting the expression "4.00", and substituting the expression "5.00"; and

- (c) By omitting the expression "3.00", and substituting the expression "4.00".
- 3. Goods and services tax included—The fees prescribed by these regulations are inclusive of goods and services tax under the Goods and Services Tax Act 1985.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force on 1 July 1992, increase various fees payable under the Chattels Transfer Act 1924 to Registrars.

The fee for filing a memorandum of satisfaction or of partial satisfaction and entry thereof is increased from \$10 to \$11.

The fee for searching an instrument is increased from \$4 to \$5.

The fee for each sheet of a copy or an extract of or from any document is increased from \$3 to \$4.

The fees prescribed are inclusive of goods and services tax.
