THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (FIELD GLASSES) ORDER 1957

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 8th day of May 1957

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. S. G. HOLLAND PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Field Glasses) Order 1957.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 10th day of May 1957.

2. Schedule XIII to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (as set out in the First Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948) is hereby modified by the addition thereto of the duty set out in the Schedule hereto.

3. The application of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.

4. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.

This order reduces the most favoured nation rate of Customs duty on field glasses from 50 per cent to 45 per cent.
