THE CLOTHING TRADE LABOUR LEGISLATION SUSPENSION ORDER 1940.

Whereas it appears to me to be expedient for maintaining supplies and services essential to the life of the community, I, Patrick Charles Webb, Minister of Labour, pursuant to the Labour Legislation Emergency Regulations 1940, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Clothing Trade Labour Legislation

Suspension Order 1940.

2. This Order applies to female workers commencing employment in the clothing trade after reaching the age of twenty-one years.

3. The provisions of all Acts and all regulations thereunder, and all awards and industrial agreements under the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1925, and of all other voluntary agreements affecting conditions of employment, shall be and are hereby suspended so far as any such provisions operate to require the employment as an apprentice of any female worker who enters the clothing trade for the first time after reaching the age of twenty-one years, subject, however, to such workers being paid not less than the following weekly rates of wages:—

- 4. Female workers who are already in the trade at the date of taking effect of this Order and who commenced their employment in the trade after they had reached the age of twenty-one years shall be paid in accordance with the above scale, but in determining the rates of payment to which any such worker shall be entitled there shall be taken into account all periods of such person's employment at the trade, whether before or after the taking effect of this Order.
- 5. This Order shall come into effect on and from the date of notification hereof in the *Gazette*.
