# THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (PIPES) ORDER 1956

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to section 12 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being satisfied that the existing duties are likely to operate in an injurious manner generally to the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

#### ORDER

- 1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Pipes) Order 1956.
  - (2) This order shall come into force on the 20th day of July 1956.
- 2. The existing Tariff (being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1934 as amended by the Customs Tariff Amendment Order 1938 No. 2\*) is hereby suspended in so far as it relates to the goods set out in the First Schedule hereto.
- 3. The duties set out in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby imposed and the exemptions from duty set out in that Schedule are hereby created.
- 4. Schedule XIII to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (as set out in the First Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948 and modified by the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Order 1951†) is hereby further modified by the deletion therefrom of the duties set out in the Third Schedule hereto and by the substitution therefor of the duties set out in the Fourth Schedule hereto.
- 5. The Second Schedule to the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Act 1948, as amended by the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade Order 1951†, is hereby further modified by the deletion therefrom of the duties set out in the Fifth Schedule hereto and by the substitution therefor of the duties set out in the Sixth Schedule hereto.

- 6. Every exemption from duty or application of duty hereby effected shall be subject to the provisions of section 143 of the Customs Act 1913.
- 7. All duties of Customs that have become due and payable and all penalties and forfeitures that have been incurred before the commencement of this order shall be recovered and enforced as if this order had not been made.
- 8. Nothing in this order shall be deemed to affect the provisions of section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1930 in respect of the imposition on any goods affected by this order of surtax upon the duties hereby imposed.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order provides for Customs Tariff changes in respect of various types of pipes, tubes, and fittings on the recommendation of the Board of Trade following a public Tariff inquiry.

Apart from increased duties on drinking straws, cardboard tubes, and brass pipe fittings, and reduced duties on certain steam pipes, rates of duty are unchanged, but the relevant Tariff items have been rearranged.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936. Date of notification in *Gazette*: 19 July 1956.
