THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (RHODESIA) ORDER 1965

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 17th day of November 1965

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 6 of the Customs Amendment Act 1921, as amended by section 7 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and being of opinion that the exercise of the powers conferred on him by the said section 6 is necessary in protection and furtherance of the public interest, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. (1) This order may be cited as the Customs Tariff (Rhodesia) Order 1965.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 18th day of November 1965.

2. The duties and exemptions from duty provided for in accordance with the General Tariff set out in the Customs Tariff, being the First Schedule to the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1961, as from time to time modified (whether before or after the commencement of this order), are hereby applied to goods being the produce or manufacture of Rhodesia, in lieu of the duties and exemptions from duty set forth in the British Preferential Tariff.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is that Rhodesia will no longer be included among the countries whose goods have the benefit of the British Preferential Tariff when imported into New Zealand. Instead, the General Tariff will apply.
