THE CHEESE WHOLESALE PRICES NOTICE 1951

PURSUANT to the Marketing Act, 1936, the Minister of Marketing doth hereby fix the wholesale prices at which cheese intended for consumption in New Zealand may be bought or sold as follows :—

1. (1) This notice may be cited as the Cheese Wholesale Prices Notice 1951.

(2) This notice shall come into force on the 1st day of March, 1951.

(3) In this notice, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“ The said regulations ” means the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938* :

“ Export size ”, in relation to any cheese, means a cheese weighing or reputed to weigh approximately 80 lb. :

“ Medium size ”, in relation to any cheese, means a cheese weighing or reputed to weigh approximately 40 lb. :

“ Pancake size ”, in relation to any cheese, means a cheese weighing or reputed to weigh approximately 20 lb. :

“ Standard crate lot ”, in relation to a transaction for the sale of cheeses, means a lot consisting of two cheeses of export size, or three cheeses of medium size, or six cheeses of pancake size :

“ Manufacturing dairy ” means a dairy registered as a cheese factory pursuant to the said regulations :

“ Sale ” includes barter and every other disposition for valuable consideration :

“ Wholesaler ”, in relation to the sale of any cheese, means a person who sells the cheese to any person for the purpose of resale.

(4) The Cheese Wholesale Prices Notice 1950† is hereby revoked.

APPLICATION OF THIS NOTICE

2. (1) This notice applies only with respect to Cheddar cheese that is sold by a manufacturing dairy or by a wholesaler within four months after the date of its manufacture, and applies only to the sale of export size, medium size, and pancake size cheeses.

(2) For the purpose of this clause the date of the manufacture of any cheese shall be deemed to be the date indicated on the cheese in accordance with the requirements of the said regulations.

FIXING MAXIMUM PRICES FOR CHEESE TO WHICH THIS NOTICE
APPLIES

3. (1) The maximum price that may be charged or received for any cheese to which this notice applies shall be computed as follows:—

(2) For the purposes of this clause the weight of any cheeses sold in crates shall be deemed to be their weight as at the time of crating, and the weight of uncrated cheeses shall be deemed to be their actual weight when delivered to the purchaser.

4. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding clause of this notice, the maximum prices that may be charged or received for any cheese to which this notice applies by any manufacturing dairy upon any sale to a wholesaler shall be $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per pound less than the prices computed in accordance with the said clause.
