HIS EXCELLENCY THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE GOVERNMENT IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Health Act 1956, His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Drainage and Plumbing Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Drainage and Plumbing Regulations 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.
- 2. Pipes—(1) Regulation 68 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (3) (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Drainage and Plumbing Regulations 1959, Amendment No. 2†) the words "and shall be in accordance with the thicknesses set out in Tables G and H hereunder", and substituting the words "and, if for sanitation, shall be in accordance with the thicknesses set out in Table H hereunder".
- (2) Regulation 68 of the principal regulations is hereby further amended by revoking Table G which relates to copper pipes for water.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

A new copper tube suitable for water installation is now being manufactured but its size varies from the standard shown in Table G. The amendment provides for the use of either material and permits a choice for the approving authorities.
