ORDER

**1. Title**—This order may be cited as the District Courts Amendment Act Commencement Order 1992.

**2. Commencement of section 6 of the District Courts Amendment Act 1989**—Section 6 of the District Courts Amendment Act 1989 shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1992.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.*

This order brings into force, on 1 July 1992, section 6 of the District Courts Amendment Act 1989. That section repeals section 55 of the District Courts Act 1947, and substitutes a new section.

The new section 55 provides that the District Court may, on application made in accordance with the District Courts Rules,—

- (a) Issue a commission, request, or order to examine witnesses abroad for the purposes of any proceedings:
- (b) Direct and supervise the service abroad of any process of the Court.
