A PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS by subsection (3) of section 1 of the Decimal Currency Act 1964 it is provided that Parts II and III of that Act shall come into force on a date to be appointed by the Governor-General by Proclamation:

Now, therefore, pursuant to the said Act, I, Brigadier Sir Bernard Edward Fergusson, the Governor-General of New Zealand, hereby proclaim as follows:

1. This Proclamation may be cited as the Decimal Currency Act Commencement Order 1967.

2. Parts II and III of the Decimal Currency Act 1964 shall come into force on the 10th day of July 1967.
