Rules

1 Title

These rules are the District Courts (Property Law Act 2007) Amendment Rules 2007.

2 Commencement

These rules come into force on 1 January 2008.

3 Principal rules amended

These rules amend the District Courts Rules 1992.

4 Denial of contract

Rule 206 is amended by omitting “the Statute of Frauds 1677 or the Contracts Enforcement Act 1956” and substituting “subpart 2 of Part 2 of the Property Law Act 2007 (which requires certain contracts to be in writing)”.

5 Application of this Part

Rule 452(1)(a) is amended by revoking subparagraph (xxiii) and substituting the following subparagraph:

“(xxiii) sections 313, 316, 334, 341, and 357 of the Property Law Act 2007:”.

These rules amend the District Courts Rules 1992. They come into force on 1 January 2008.

The amendments are consequential on the Property Law Act 2007. They replace references to repealed enactments with references to enactments that, with or without modification, replace, or correspond to, the enactments repealed.
