ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 26th day of November 1984

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL PURSUANT to section 122 of the District Courts Act 1947, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following rules.

RULES

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These rules may be cited as the District Courts Rules 1948, Amendment No. 18, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the District Courts Rules 1948* (hereinafter referred to as the principal rules).
 - (2) These rules shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1985.
- 2. New scale of Court fees prescribed—(1) The principal rules are hereby amended by revoking the Third Schedule (as substituted by rule 2 (1) of the District Courts Rules 1948, Amendment No. 17), and substituting the new Third Schedule set out in the Schedule to these rules.
- (2) The new Third Schedule substituted by this rule shall apply in respect of any proceedings commenced on or after the date of the coming into force of these rules.
- (3) In respect of any proceedings commenced before the date of the coming into force of these rules, no further fee shall be payable under the Schedule hereby revoked, and the appropriate fees, if any, set out in the new Third Schedule substituted by this rule shall be payable in respect of any step in the proceedings taken on or after that date.
- **3. Revocation**—The District Courts Rules 1948, Amendment No. 17 are hereby consequentially revoked.
