ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 6th day of September 1976

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 120 of the Customs Act 1966, as amended by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act 1974, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Developing Countries Tariff Order 1976.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Developing countries—The countries set out in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be developing countries for the purpose of the Customs Act 1966.

3. Consequential revocations—The Developing Countries Tariff Order 1972* and the Developing Countries Tariff Order 1972, Amendment No. 1†, are hereby consequentially revoked.
