ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 24th day of June 1985

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 120 (3) of the Customs Act 1966 (as amended by section 5 of the Customs Acts Amendment Act (No. 2) 1977, and further amended by section 5 (3) of the Customs Acts Amendment Act (No. 2) 1980), His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Developing Countries Tariff Order 1976, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Developing Countries Tariff Order 1976* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of July 1985.

2. Developing Countries—The Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by omitting from—

- (a) Part A the items “Bahrein”, “Kuwait”, “Libya”, “Nauru”, “Oman”, “Qatar”, “Saudi Arabia”, “Singapore”, “Trinidad and Tobago”, and “United Arab Emirates (all seven)”:

- (b) Part B the items "Bermuda" and "Brunei":

- (d) Part E the items "Guam" and "Virgin Islands".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 July 1985, removes Bahrein, Bermuda, Brunei, French Polynesia, Guam, Kuwait, Libya, Nauru, New Caledonia, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Trinidad and Tobago, United Arab Emirates, and Virgin Islands from the Developing Countries Preference.
