**THE DANGEROUS DRUGS REGULATIONS 1951,  
AMENDMENT NO. 5**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 21st day of December 1960

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Dangerous Drugs Act 1927, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1951, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1951\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 59, the following regulation:

“59A. Section 6A of the Act, as inserted by section 4 of the Dangerous Drugs Amendment Act 1960, shall not apply to apomorphine, which is a product obtained from the phenanthrene alkaloids of opium.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations amend the Dangerous Drugs Regulations 1951 and qualify section 6A of the Dangerous Drugs Act 1927 by providing that the provisions of that section shall not apply to apomorphine. This means that apomorphine is not controlled in any way under the Dangerous Drugs Act 1927.
