## THE DELIVERY EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1942, AMENDMENT NO. 3

At the Government House at Wellington, this 9th day of June, 1943

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Delivery Emergency Regulations 1942, Amendment No. 3, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Delivery Emergency Regulations 1942\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- (2) These regulations shall come into force twenty-eight days after notification in the *Gazette* of the making thereof.
- 2. (1) Regulation 3 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the definition of the term "commodity", and substituting the following:—
  - "'Commodity' means bread, milk, cream, goods delivered by drapers or by other persons dealing in wearing-apparel, articles and materials collected for cleaning by laundries or delivered after such cleaning, and such meat and groceries as are being carried for delivery to a person who is not engaged in the business of selling meat or groceries, as the case may be:".
- (2) The notice given by the Minister pursuant to Regulation 3 of the principal regulations adding to commodities for the purpose of those regulations (being dated the 4th day of August, 1942, and published in the *Gazette* on the 6th day of the same month at page 2005), and the amending notice given by the Minister (being dated the 26th day of February, 1943, and published in the *Gazette* on the 4th day of March, 1943, at page 283), are hereby revoked.

- 3. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following new subclause thereto:—
- "(3) In any proceedings for an offence against these regulations the production of a copy of the Gazette or an extract therefrom purporting to be printed by the Government Printer containing a notice providing for a scheme for the delivery of a commodity shall be prima facie evidence that the scheme has been made pursuant to these regulations and that all the requirements relating to the provision of the scheme have been fulfilled."
