DAIRY FACTORY MANAGERS REGULATIONS 1941, AMENDMENT NO. 10

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Dairy Industry Act 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Factory Managers Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Factory Managers Regulations 1941* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the Gazette.

2. (1) Regulation 6:4 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 6 of the Dairy Factory Managers Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 2 and further amended by regulation 2, Amendment No. 7) is hereby further amended by revoking the proviso to paragraph (f), and substituting the following proviso:

"Provided that where an application is in respect of a milk powder factory operated by a steam plant requiring the services of a person holding a qualification higher than that of second-class engine driver, the Board may nevertheless grant the application notwithstanding that the applicant does not hold the qualification of second-class engine driver or higher, but, in any such case, the certificate of registration of the applicant shall be endorsed with a condition that his certificate entitles him to manage only those milk powder factories where operators are required to hold qualifications higher than that of second-class engine driver."

(2) Paragraph (b) of regulation 2 of the Dairy Factory Managers Regulations 1941, Amendment No. 9, is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations entitle the Dairy Factory Managers Registration Board to waive a requirement that dairy factory managers be the holder of a certificate of competency as a second class engine driver in cases where the application is in respect of certain milk powder factories.
