**THE DAIRY FACTORY SUPPLY REGULATIONS 1936,
AMENDMENT NO. 5**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 9th day of July 1958

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Factory Supply Regulations 1936, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Factory Supply Regulations 1936* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 13, and substituting the following regulation:

“13. Nothing in these regulations shall be deemed to affect the right of any person being the occupier of a supplying dairy to supply at his option either whole milk or cream to the owner of any manufacturing dairy:

“Provided that in the exercise of this option no transfer by the said occupier of supplies of milk or cream produced in his dairy shall be made except in conformity with the provisions of any Act or regulations governing the transfer of those supplies:

“Provided also that where in the opinion of the Board, acting in consultation with the Dairy Products Marketing Commission, it is desirable to limit transfer of supplies in any particular district or supply area from one company to another, the Board may restrict the occupier of any supplying dairy from transferring his supplies from cream to milk in such manner and for such period as the Board in its discretion thinks fit.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations give the Dairy Board power to restrict the occupier of any supplying dairy from transferring his supplies from cream to milk in such manner and for such period as the Board thinks fit.
