**THE DANGEROUS GOODS (CLASS 2—GASES) REGULATIONS
1980, AMENDMENT NO. 4**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 3rd day of February 1986

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 35 of the Dangerous Goods Act 1974, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Goods (Class 2—Gases) Regulations 1980, Amendment No. 4, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dangerous Goods (Class 2—Gases) Regulations 1980* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Duty to display “No Smoking” notice—The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 82 (as amended by

regulation 7 of the Dangerous Goods (Class 2—Gases) Regulations 1980, Amendment No. 2), and substituting the following regulation:

“82. The licensee of any premises on which dangerous goods of Class 2 (d) are stored shall display on the premises a notice bearing the words ‘Flammable Gas, No Smoking’, which notice shall be displayed in such form and in such location as is approved by an Inspector.”

3. Revocation—Regulation 7 of the Dangerous Goods (Class 2—Gases) Regulations 1980, Amendment No. 2 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Dangerous Goods (Class 2—Gases) Regulations 1980 by revoking regulation 82, and substituting a new regulation. The new regulation no longer deals with the bringing of any source of ignition within 15 m of any place where dangerous goods of Class 2 (d) are stored on licensed premises, or where any filling or transfer operation of such goods is being conducted. That situation is covered by other provisions of the principal regulations.
