**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Dangerous Goods Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Goods (Licensing Authorities) Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed to form part of the Dangerous Goods (Licensing Authorities) Regulations 1958\* (herein referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1966.

2. The First Schedule of the principal regulations is hereby amended—

- (a) By inserting in the portion of Part I of that Schedule that relates to County Councils (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Dangerous Goods (Licensing Authorities) Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 1), after the word "Awatere", the word "Bruce":
- (b) By omitting from the portion of Part I of that Schedule that relates to Borough Councils the word "Naseby".
