THE DANGEROUS GOODS ORDER 1972

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of March 1972

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. J. R. MARSHALL, PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Dangerous Goods Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Dangerous Goods Order 1972.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1972.

2. Licensing authority—The Second Schedule to the Dangerous Goods Act 1957 is hereby amended—

(a) By omitting from that part of the Schedule that relates to borough councils the word “Otorohanga”:

(b) By inserting in that part of the Schedule that relates to county councils, in their appropriate alphabetical order, the words “Otorohanga” and “Taumarunui”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is to constitute the Taumarunui County Council and the Otorohanga County Council licensing authorities for the purposes of the Dangerous Goods Act 1957, and to omit from that part of the Second Schedule to the Act the name of the Otorohanga Borough Council.
