PURSUANT to section 4 of the Dangerous Goods Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Dangerous Goods Order 1973.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 6th day of April 1973.

2. Licensing authority—The Second Schedule to the Dangerous Goods Act 1957 is hereby amended by inserting in that part of the Schedule that relates to County Councils, after the word “Matamata”, the word “Oroua”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is to constitute the Oroua County Council as a licensing authority for the purposes of the Dangerous Goods Act 1957.
