THE DANGEROUS GOODS ORDER 1974

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 4th day of March 1974

Present:

THE HON. H. WATT PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Dangerous Goods Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Dangerous Goods Order 1974.

(2) This order shall come into force on the 31st day of March 1974.

2. Licensing authorities—The Second Schedule to the Dangerous Goods Act 1957 is hereby amended—

(a) By omitting from that part of the Schedule that relates to Borough Councils the word “Opotiki”;

(b) By inserting in that part of the Schedule that relates to County Councils, in its appropriate alphabetical order, the word “Opotiki”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The effect of this order is to constitute the Opotiki County Council (created by the amalgamation of the former Opotiki Borough with Opotiki County) as a licensing authority for the purposes of the Dangerous Goods Act 1957.
