THE DANGEROUS GOODS ORDER 1978

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 6th day of June 1978

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 38 of the Dangerous Goods Act 1974, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Dangerous Goods Order 1978.

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Schedule amended—The Schedule to the Dangerous Goods Act 1974 is hereby amended—

- (a) By inserting in Class 5 (a), after the word “permanganates,” the words “calcium hypochlorite or mixtures thereof containing more than 39 percent chlorine,”;
- (b) By inserting in Class 8, after the words “sulphuric acid,” the words “chlorosulphonic acid”.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

The order amends the Schedule to the Dangerous Goods Act 1974 by adding calcium hypochlorite or mixtures thereof containing more than 39 percent chlorine to Class 5 (a) (oxidising substances), and chlorosulphonic acid to Class 8 (corrosives).
