PURSUANT to section 38 of the Dangerous Goods Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Dangerous Goods Regulations 1958, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dangerous Goods Regulations 1958* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the

date of their notification in the Gazette.

2. Application of regulations to certain dangerous goods of Class II— The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after

regulation 2, the following regulation:

"2A. These regulations shall apply to any dangerous goods of Class II which have a flashing point greater than 141°F in the same manner and to the same extent as if those dangerous goods were dangerous goods of Class III."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Dangerous Goods Regulations 1958.

The principal regulations are to apply to dangerous goods of Class II having a flashing point greater than 141°r as if they were dangerous goods of Class III.

The main effect of the amendment is to allow more volatile petroleum fractions to be included within the specifications for fuel oil when crude oil is being refuel. is being refined.
