AMENDMENT NO. 1

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of May 1958

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. W. NASH PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Agriculture (Emergency Powers) Act 1934, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Industry Accounts Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Industry Accounts Regulations 1957\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Form 1 in the Schedule to the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following clause:

“(3) A statement in the following form:

“ ‘Dairy Division analysis of the company’s produce shows in respect of the current year that for every 100 lb. of butterfat credited to suppliers, ( ) lb. were received. This is considered to be (within or below, as the case may be) reasonable limits. On the basis of the above, the surplus on (buttermaking or cheese-making, as the case may be) is (overstated or understated, as the case may be) by ( ) per lb. fat and the above payout figures would be correspondingly affected.’ ”

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations require the directors of every cooperative dairy company to include in the information required to be contained in the directors' report a statement setting forth the corrected payout figure for butterfat received from suppliers in respect of the current year.
