THE DIPLOMATIC IMMUNITIES (WESTERN SAMOAN TRADE AND DEVELOPMENT COMMISSIONER) ORDER 1967

Pursuant to the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title—This order may be cited as the Diplomatic Immunities (Western Samoan Trade and Development Commissioner) Order 1967.
- 2. Immunities of Trade and Development Commissioner—The Western Samoan Trade and Development Commissioner and the Assistant Western Samoan Trade and Development Commissioner shall enjoy the like immunity from suit and legal process and the like inviolability of official premises and official archives as are accorded to foreign consular officers.
- 3. Immunities of official staff—The members of the official staff of the Western Samoan Trade and Development Commissioner, other than the Assistant Western Samoan Trade and Development Commissioner, shall enjoy the like immunity from suit and legal process as is accorded to the members of the official staff of foreign consular officers.
- 4. Application of order to island territories—This order shall be in force in Niue and the Tokelau Islands.
- 5. Order to be reserved enactment in Niue—This order is hereby declared to be a reserved enactment for the purposes of section 38 of the Niue Act 1966.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order specifies the immunities that are conferred on the Western Samoan Trade and Development Commissioner and his official staff.
