ORDER IN COUNCIL

At Wellington this 18th day of December 1996

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to section 4 of the Disabled Persons Employment Promotion Act 1960, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, on the recommendation of the Minister of Employment (made after consulting the unions, associations, and organisations referred to in section 5 of that Act) hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Disabled Persons Employment Promotion Order 1996.
- (2) This order shall come into force on the 28th day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.
 - 2. Interpretation—In this order—
 - (a) "The principal Act" means the Disabled Persons Employment Promotion Act 1960; and
 - (b) Terms defined in section 2 of the principal Act have the meanings given to them by that section.

- 3. Exemptions—(1) Subject to subclause (2) of this clause,—
- (a) Each organisation named in the first column of Part A or Part B of the Schedule to this order is hereby granted exemption, in respect of every sheltered workshop operated by that organisation specified opposite its name in the second column of that schedule, from all provisions of the Minimum Wage Act 1983; and
- (b) Each organisation named in the first column of Part A of the Schedule to this order is hereby granted exemption, in respect of every sheltered workshop operated by that organisation specified opposite its name in the second column of that schedule, from all provisions of the Holidays Act 1981.
- (2) No exemption of any organisation granted by subclause (1) of this clause applies to the employment, or remuneration for employment, of—
 - (a) Any person employed by the organisation under an employment contract entered into before the day on which this order was made; or
 - (b) Any person employed by the organisation, under an employment contract entered into on or after the day on which this order was made, to provide administrative, advisory, liaison, managerial, supervisory, technical or other similar services—

(i) For or in respect of other employees of the organisation; or

(ii) For clients of the organisation.

- (3) No exemption granted by subclause (1) of this clause is limited or affected by any change of the name of the organisation to which it relates.
- **4. Conditions**—Every exemption under clause 3 (1) of this order is granted subject to the condition that it will lapse if—
 - (a) The organisation to which it was granted ceases to be approved by the Minister under section 3 of the principal Act; or
 - (b) The sheltered workshop in respect of which it was granted—
 - (i) Ceases to be owned or controlled by that organisation; or
 - (ii) Ceases to be a sheltered workshop.
- **5. Revocations**—Every order under section **4** of the principal Act that—
 - (a) Was made before the commencement of this order; and
 - (b) Granted an exemption to an organisation that is named in the first column of the Schedule to this order (whatever its name was when the exemption was granted) or was the predecessor of an organisation named in that column,—

is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force 28 days after notification in the Gazette, exempts certain sheltered workshops from the Minimum Wage Act 1988, and exempts some of them from the Holidays Act 1981 too.
