PURSUANT to the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. This order may be cited as the Diplomatic Privileges (WHO) Order 1959, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Diplomatic Privileges (WHO) Order 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

2. Clause 11 of the principal order is hereby amended by inserting in subclause (1), after the words "member Governments" where they first occur, the words "(including Governments of associate members)".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. The purpose of this order is to make it clear that Governments which are associate members of the organisation may waive the immunities and privileges conferred by clause 11 of the principal order on the representatives of those Governments.
