

THE DAIRY PRODUCE REGULATIONS 1938, AMENDMENT NO. 13

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 28th day of November 1956

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Dairy Industry Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 13, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting in subclause (1), after the definition of the term "Grading

store", the following definition:

"'Ice cream base' means a substance consisting of butterfat and sugar to which may be added flavouring, butter curd, and non-fat milk solids".

3. Regulation 8 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding to subclause (1), as amended by regulation 3 of the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 11, the following paragraph:

(q) A factory for the manufacture of ice cream base".
