**THE DAIRY PRODUCE REGULATIONS 1938,  
AMENDMENT NO. 22**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 13th day of August 1962

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Dairy Industry Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

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**REGULATIONS**

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 22, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. For the purposes of the principal regulations, the term “antibiotic” means any substance derived from, or produced by, living organisms, and capable of inhibiting the life process of micro-organisms.

3. Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:

“(24) Every owner shall, as often as and in such manner as he may from time to time be required so to do by notice given under the hand of the Director, test for the presence of antibiotics any milk delivered to the manufacturing dairy.”

4. Regulation 18 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:

“(12) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this regulation, all graded milk which is tested pursuant to subclause (24) of regulation 13 of these regulations and found to contain any antibiotic shall be paid for at a rate of not less than 6d. per pound of butterfat less than the rate that would otherwise have been payable for it according to its grade:

“Provided that nothing in this clause shall apply in any case where the quantity of antibiotic contained in the milk does not exceed such quantity as may from time to time be specified in that behalf by the Director.”

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#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations require owners of milk, on the request of the Director, to have milk delivered to a manufacturing dairy tested for antibiotics and, if the milk is found to contain antibiotics, authorise a reduced payment for the milk.
