**THE DAIRY PRODUCE REGULATIONS 1938,
AMENDMENT NO. 6**

ORDER IN COUNCIL

THE HON. K. J. HOLYOAKE PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Dairy Industry Act, 1908, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 6, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of August, 1951.

2. Regulation 1 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (1) the words " Regulation 10 — Protection of Milk and Cream from Contamination ", and substituting the words " Regulation 10 — Protection of Dairy Produce from Contamination ".

3. The principal regulations are hereby amended by omitting from the heading to regulation 10 the words " Milk and Cream ", and substituting the words " Dairy Produce ".

4. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking clause (7), and substituting the following clauses :—

" (7) All milk and cream intended for delivery to a manufacturing dairy shall, from the time when it is produced or separated till the time when it is manufactured into dairy products in the manufacturing dairy, be at all times adequately protected against the entry of or contamination by any bird, insect, rodent, animal, or foreign matter ; and all milk from which cream is intended to be separated for delivery to a manufacturing dairy shall be at all times so protected from the time the milk is produced until the cream is separated.

" (7A) Every owner of a manufacturing dairy shall take all proper precautions to ensure that his dairy and all dairy apparatus and materials used in the manufacture of dairy products in that dairy are at all times adequately protected so far as is practicable against the entry of or contamination by any bird, insect, rodent, animal, or foreign matter."

5. Regulation 10 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following clauses :—

“(12) Every person who is engaged in the performance of any duties in connection with the manufacture of dairy produce in any manufacturing dairy shall at all times while so engaged wear clean white or light coloured outer garments and clean head covering and shall maintain his person at all times while so engaged in a state of cleanliness.

“(13) No person shall smoke in any room in which the manufacture of dairy produce is in progress or in the vicinity of any receiving or processing operation for the time being carried on in any manufacturing dairy.

“(14) No person who is suffering from any communicable disease within the meaning of the Health Act, 1920, or who is a carrier of any infectious disease within the meaning of that Act, or who is suffering from any infectious condition or any condition causing a discharge of pus or serum from any part of his head, neck, hands, or arms, shall engage in the performance of any duties in connection with the manufacture of dairy produce in any manufacturing dairy.

“(15) Every owner of a manufacturing dairy shall provide or cause to be provided in positions on his dairy premises approved by an Inspector adequate and properly equipped sanitary conveniences and ablution facilities of a standard approved by an Inspector for the use of persons employed in and about the manufacturing dairy.

“(16) Every owner of a manufacturing dairy shall prominently display or cause to be prominently displayed in suitable conspicuous positions in the dairy notices or placards printed in conspicuous plain capital letters in the words ‘Smoking prohibited’, or to the like effect.

“(17) No owner of a manufacturing dairy shall employ or cause or permit to be employed in the performance of any duties in connection with the manufacture of dairy produce in the dairy any person who fails to comply with the requirements of clause (12) or clause (13) of this regulation or who is prohibited from engaging in the performance of any such duties by clause (14) of this regulation.

“(18) Every owner of a manufacturing dairy shall prominently display or cause to be prominently displayed in some conspicuous place in his dairy an extract from these regulations setting out the provisions of clauses (12), (13), and (14) of this regulation.”

EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations make further provision for preventing the contamination of dairy produce during the course of its manufacture into dairy products.
