**THE DAIRY PRODUCE REGULATIONS 1938,  
AMENDMENT NO. 9**

**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

At the Government House at Wellington, this 12th day of May 1954

Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Dairy Industry Act 1952, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Produce Regulations 1938\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. (1) Regulation 38 of the principal regulations is hereby amended as follows:

(a) By revoking subclause (7), and substituting the following subclauses.

“(7) Every owner of a creamery shall, in respect of each creamery owned by him, within twenty-one days after the close of each month in which he has manufactured any butter, complete and forward to the grader at the grading store to which the dairy produce of the owner is normally forwarded for grading a statement in the form No. 31 in the Second Schedule hereto signed and dated by the owner. The term ‘cream’, when used in the said form, shall not include whey cream.

“(7A) Every owner of a creamery shall, in respect of each creamery owned by him, immediately after the close of each financial year in which he has manufactured any butter, complete and forward to the grader at the grading store to which the dairy produce of the owner is normally forwarded for grading a statement in the form No. 32 in the Second Schedule hereto signed and dated by the owner. The term ‘cream’, when used in the said form, shall not include whey cream.

“(7B) Every owner of a cheese factory or a standardized cheese factory shall, in respect of each such factory owned by him, within twenty-one days after the close of each month in which he has manufactured any cheese, complete and forward to the grader at the grading store to which the dairy produce of the owner is normally forwarded for grading a statement in the form No. 33 in the Second Schedule hereto signed and dated by the owner.

“(7C) Every owner of a cheese factory or standardized cheese factory shall, in respect of each such factory owned by him, immediately after the close of the financial year of the owner, complete and forward to the grader at the grading store to which the dairy produce of the owner is normally forwarded for grading a statement in the form No. 34 in the Schedule hereto signed and dated by the owner.”

- (b) By omitting from subclause (1) the words “Clauses (3), (4), (7), (8), (9), and (10)”, and substituting the words “Sub-clauses (3), (4), (7), (7A), (7B), (8), (9), and (10)”.
  - (c) By omitting from subclause (8) the words “clause (7)”, and substituting the words “subclause (7B)”.
  - (d) By omitting from subclause (9) the words “clause (7)”, and substituting the words “subclauses (7), (7A), or (7B)”.
  - (e) By omitting from subclause (10) the words “clause (7)”, and substituting the words “subclause (7B)”.
- (2) The principal regulations are hereby amended by adding to the Second Schedule thereto as forms Nos. 31, 32, 33, and 34 the forms set out in the Schedule hereto.

## EXPLANATORY NOTE

[This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.]

These regulations prescribe the forms to be completed by owners of creameries and cheese factories.

Changes effected by the regulations are—

- (a) The information required to be supplied will be more extensive:
- (b) Returns will require to be made annually as well as monthly:
- (c) The information will be forwarded to the grader at the grading store to which the dairy produce of the owner is normally forwarded for grading instead of to the Department of Agriculture.

Issued under the authority of the Regulations Act 1936.

These regulations are administered in the Department of Agriculture.
