# THE DOGS REGISTRATION (PREVENTION OF HYDATID DISEASE) REGULATIONS 1938, AMENDMENT NO. 5

# COBHAM, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 23rd day of December 1958

### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Dogs Registration Act 1955, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

### REGULATIONS

1. (1) These regulations may be cited as the Dogs Registration (Prevention of Hydatid Disease) Regulations 1938, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dogs Registration (Prevention of Hydatid Disease) Regulations 1938\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January

1959.

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regula-

tion 5, and substituting the following regulation:

"5. (1) The fee payable in respect of the supply by the Registrar of the approved remedy to every person registering a dog during any year shall be 1s. in respect of each dog registered:

"Provided that, with the prior approval of the Minister of Internal Affairs, any local authority may, by resolution publicly notified in some newspaper circulating within its district, declare that, on and from a later date specified in the resolution, the fee so payable in respect of each dog registered in its district during the period commencing on that date and ending with the 31st day of December 1959 shall be such amount, exceeding 1s. but not exceeding £1, as is specified in the resolution:

"Provided further that not later than the 30th day of November in the year 1959, and not later than that date in any subsequent year, any local authority, with the prior approval of the Minister of Internal Affairs,

may by resolution publicly notified in some newspaper circulating within its district, fix the fee payable in respect of the supply of the approved remedy to every person registering a dog in its district during the year commencing on the 1st day of January next following the date on which the resolution is so notified at such amount, exceeding 1s, but not exceeding £1, as is stated in the resolution.

"(2) Where in any year a dog is registered after the 31st day of July, the fee prescribed by the local authority pursuant to this regulation shall

be reduced by a half.

"(3) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this regulation, the total fees which any owner is required by this regulation to pay for the supply of the approved remedy in respect of all dogs registered by him in any year shall not in any case exceed £5.

"(4) Every fee payable under this regulation shall be paid to the

Registrar at the time of registration."

3. The principal regulations are hereby further amended by inserting, after regulation 5 (as substituted by regulation 2 of these regulations), the

following regulation:

"5A. All fees paid to a local authority under regulation 5 hereof, which, by section 35 of the Dogs Registration Act 1955, are required to be paid into its ordinary general fund, shall be credited to a separate account and used for preventing and controlling hydatid disease and for no other purpose."

4. The following regulations are hereby revoked, namely:

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their

general effect.

Regulation 2 of these regulations re-enacts in an amended form the provisions of the principal regulations relating to the fee payable by the owner registering a dog in respect of the supply of an approved remedy for hydatid disease. The fee is to be 1s. as at present, but, with the approval of the Minister of Internal Affairs, may be increased by the local authority concerned up to a maximum of £1 in respect of each dog. The total fees payable by one owner in any year

in respect of all dogs registered by him are not to exceed £5.

Regulation 3 provides that all fees for the approved remedies paid to a local authority are to be credited to a separate account, and used only for preventing

and controlling hydatid disease.

Regulation 4 revokes some spent amendments of the principal regulations.
