**THE DAIRY SUPPLY CONTROL ORDER 1945,
AMENDMENT NO. 1**

PURSUANT to the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939, the Minister of Agriculture hereby makes the following Order.

ORDER

1. This Order may be cited as the Dairy Supply Control Order 1945, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Dairy Supply Control Order 1945* (hereinafter referred to as the principal Order).

2. Clause 5 of the principal Order is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause :—

“(2) Except as otherwise provided in this Order, every person who is for the time being the occupier of a dairy with respect to which this clause applies shall, while this Order continues in force, supply all milk or cream disposed of from that dairy to a creamery or to a cheese-factory the owner or manager of which is not prohibited by any order, determination, or instruction of the Executive Commission of Agriculture for the time being in force under the Dairy Factory Supply Regulations 1936 from receiving milk or cream from that dairy :

“Provided that the occupier shall not supply such milk or cream to more than one creamery or to more than one cheese-factory during the period from the 1st day of August in any year until the 31st day of May in the next succeeding year if the dairy is situated in the North Island, or during the period from the 1st day of September in any year until the 30th day of June in the next succeeding year if the dairy is situated in the South Island :

“Provided also that, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in any other enactment, the occupier may at any time whatsoever while this Order is in force change from supplying a cheese-factory to supplying a creamery.”

3. The principal Order is hereby further amended by revoking clause 6, and substituting the following clauses :—

“6. The Deputy Chairman of the Executive Commission of Agriculture is hereby authorized to grant exemption from compliance with the requirements of clause 4 or clause 5 of this Order in any case in which the granting of any such exemption is, in the opinion of the Deputy Chairman, necessary or advisable, and to make such other order to meet the circumstances of any special case as is in his opinion necessary or advisable.

“7. The foregoing provisions of this Order shall not apply in any case where a specific direction to the contrary has been given in writing under the Primary Industries Emergency Regulations 1939.”
