



THE DAYLIGHT SAVING EMERGENCY REGULATIONS 1943

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Government Buildings at Wellington, this 24th day of March, 1943.

Present :

THE HON. D. G. SULLIVAN PRESIDING IN COUNCIL.

PURSUANT to the Emergency Regulations Act, 1939, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following regulations.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Daylight Saving Emergency Regulations 1943.

2. In these regulations the expression "New Zealand standard time" has the same meaning as in the Summer Time Act, 1929.*

3. During the period beginning at 2 o'clock, New Zealand standard time, in the morning of the last Sunday in April in the year 1943 and ending at 2 o'clock, New Zealand standard time, in the morning of the last Sunday in September in the same year, the time for general purposes in New Zealand shall continue to be thirty minutes in advance of New Zealand standard time, and the provisions of section 3 of the Summer Time Act, 1929, shall apply with respect to that period as if it were included in the period of summer time.

4. The Daylight Saving Emergency Regulations 1942† are hereby revoked.
