THE DRUG TARIFF 1964, AMENDMENT NO. 1

Pursuant to the Social Security Act 1938, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following direction.

- 1. (1) This direction may be cited as the Drug Tariff 1964, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Drug Tariff 1964.*
 - (2) This direction shall come into force on the 31st day of March 1965.

2. Clause 7 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking

subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

- "(2) The pricing of a medical prescription shall also be in accordance with every Prescription Pricing Supplement (being a Supplement to the Prescription Pricing Schedules) issued by the Department of Health (whether before or after the coming into force of this Drug Tariff) in respect of all pharmaceutical benefits, claims, and supporting prescriptions, whatever the date thereof, received by a Medical Officer of Health on or after the 16th day of April, August, or December, as the case may be, next following the date of the issue of that Supplement."
- 3. Clause 23 of the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if subclause (2) were revoked.
- **4.** Clause 1 of Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking subparagraph (i) of paragraph (b) of subclause (1), and substituting the following subparagraph:

"(i) In the case of capsules or tablets, the quantity for which payment may be made pursuant to any one medical pre-

scription shall not exceed a total of 16 doses:"

5. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended

by revoking clause 12, and substituting the following clause:

- "12. "Psychiatric specialist" means that the material concerned may be supplied at the cost of the Department solely pursuant to a medical practitioner's supply order written by a medical practitioner who is engaged in the practice of psychiatry."
- 6. Part II of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the items specified in the First Schedule hereto were omitted.
- 7. The Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if Part II of the Schedule thereto included the medicines, drugs, and materials specified in the Second Schedule hereto, and as if they were available to the extent specified in the said Second Schedule.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the direction, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This direction amends the Drug Tariff 1964 so as to make minor alterations in the general rules affecting the Drug Tariff and the definitions in Part I of the Schedule, and so as to provide for omissions from and additions to the list of medicines, drugs, and materials in Part II of the Schedule. Omitted items do not in all cases disappear from the list. Certain of them are included with some variation in the Schedule of additions
