THE DRUG TARIFF 1964, AMENDMENT NO. 7

PURSUANT to the Social Security Act 1964, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following direction.

1. (1) This direction may be cited as the Drug Tariff 1964, Amendment No. 7, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Drug Tariff 1964*.

(2) This direction shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1967.

2. Clause 3 of the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the following items were inserted in the proviso in their appropriate order:

“Electrode jellies:

“Long acting preparations for oral use other than those (if any) that are specified in Part II of the Schedule to this Drug Tariff:

†“Pregnancy tests:

“Preparations prescribed as foods:”.

3. Clause 7 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) The pricing of a medical prescription shall also be in accordance with the Prescription Pricing Supplement (being a Supplement to the Prescription Pricing Schedules) issued by the Department of Health (whether before or after the coming into force of this Drug Tariff) in respect of all pharmaceutical benefits, claims, and supporting prescriptions, whatever their date, received by a Medical Officer of Health on or after the 16th day of April, August, or December, or such other date as may be recommended by the Pharmaceutical Advisory Committee, as the case may be, next following the date of the issue of that Supplement.”

4. (1) Clause 8 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

“(1) The prescription retail selling price as shown in the Prescription Pricing Schedules, or when arrived at in accordance with this Part of this Drug Tariff, shall be determined on the basis of the price charged

to contractors for the material in such units as are customarily purchased by a contractor and at such prescription basic wholesale prices as are approved from time to time by the Trade Practices and Prices Commission or the Price Tribunal or any person to whom their powers are for the time being delegated, converted where necessary to prescription retail selling prices in the metric system."

(2) Clause 8 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (6), and substituting the following subclause:

"(6) Where a prescription for an injection orders the supply of a dry pack of a pharmaceutical benefit together with one or more ampoules or vials of a sterile diluent, payment for the composite items shall be made as for one prescription, and, where applicable, the provisions of subclause (1) of clause 11 of this Drug Tariff shall be applied to the combined selling price."

5. The Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 9, and substituting the following clause:

"9. In the case of items not listed in the First Schedule to the Prescription Pricing Schedules, the selling price shall be calculated as follows: The price charged to contractors (without sales tax) plus 50 percent, plus sales tax (if any) converted where necessary to the nearest appropriate metric quantity specified in subclause (2) of clause 8 of this Drug Tariff."

6. Clause 10 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (b), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(b) Where they are not listed in that Schedule, the selling price is to be calculated as follows: The price charged to contractors (without sales tax) plus 50 percent, plus sales tax (if any) equals the unit selling price. Broken quantities shall be calculated as an exact numerical proportion of the unit selling price."

7. Clause 11 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

"(2) This clause shall not apply to insulin, allergy treatment sets, diagnostic reagent tests, radiographic preparatory substances, bulk supply orders, or medical practitioners' supply orders."

8. Clause 16 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (c) of subclause (1), and substituting the following paragraph:

"(c) Where materials ordered on a medical practitioner's supply order are supplied in a dropper bottle, metal tube, or any other approved container, the sum specified in the Second Schedule to the Prescription Pricing Schedules shall be paid for that dropper bottle, metal tube, or other approved container, as the case may be."

9. The Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 19 and its heading, and substituting the following heading and clause:

"Diagnostic Reagent Tests

"19. Payment for the supply of diagnostic reagent tests shall be computed on the basis of cost price, plus 20 percent of the cost price, plus dispensing fee."

10. The Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 20 and its heading, and substituting the following heading and clause:

“Radiographic Preparatory Substances

“20. Payment in respect of the several forms of radiographic preparatory substances allowed under this Drug Tariff, including barium sulphate, shall be made on the basis of the cost price of radiographic preparatory substances as approved from time to time by the Pricing Tribunal, plus 20 percent.”

11. The Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the following heading and clause were inserted after clause 20:

“Rectified Spirit

“20A. Payment in respect of alcohol used in external preparations is to be based on spirits methylated, industrial, unless the prescriber has specified that rectified spirit is to be used.”

12. Clause 21 of the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

“(1) Pursuant to regulation 14 of the regulations, a contractor may submit claims for payment for pharmaceutical requirements supplied by him in respect of half-monthly or monthly periods.”

13. Clause 23 of the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if subclause (2) were revoked.

14. Clause 24 of the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the following proviso were added to subclause (2):

“Provided also that in any case where a patient is receiving an extended supply of drugs, those drugs shall be dispensed in monthly lots unless—

“(a) The prescriber makes a special endorsement on the prescription stating the period for which each lot is to be dispensed; or

“(b) The contractor or the patient endorses the back of the prescription with a statement of the special reasons why a quantity greater or lesser than a monthly lot is required to be dispensed.”

15. Clause 27 of the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the following proviso were added to subclause (1):

“Provided that any order for a narcotic shall be written on a separate form prepared in triplicate.”

16. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 1, and substituting the following clause:

“1. (1) ‘Antibiotic restriction’ means—

“(a) Supplied pursuant to any one medical prescription (inclusive of a repeat if any), for the treatment of an infection—

“(i) Where the infection is resistant to penicillin or sulphenamides; or

“(ii) Where a broad spectrum antibiotic is regarded by authoritative medical opinion as the treatment of choice for the infection; and

“(b) Restricted to the quantity which may be supplied pursuant to any one medical prescription (inclusive of a repeat, if any) so that—

“(i) In the case of capsules or tablets; or

“(ii) In the case of oral suspension, paediatric drops, or other preparations (other than capsules or tablets) specified in Part II of this Schedule,—
payment shall be made only in respect of a supply sufficient for seven days’ treatment (including a repeat):

“Provided that where the quantity prescribed does not coincide with the volume of a standard pack (or one or more standard packs) payment shall be made for the next smallest pack (or the smallest number of standard packs); but if a smaller pack is not available payment will be made for the next largest pack to that which was prescribed:

“Provided also that, in the case of injections, sufficient for a period not exceeding 72 hours treatment may be allowed, when necessary:

“(iii) In the case of a prescription endorsed ‘extended supply’ that is ordered for the treatment of a chronic respiratory condition or other chronic condition in which a broad spectrum antibiotic is regarded as the treatment of choice by authoritative medical opinion, payment may be made for the prescribed quantity necessary for the treatment of the patient over a period not exceeding three months’ treatment, if the amount supplied on any one occasion represents not more than one month’s supply.

“(2) Any proprietary topical application other than a preparation that is specified in Part II of this Schedule is not a charge to the Department. Likewise the quantity (if any) of the following materials, their salts and derivatives, present in any extemporaneously dispensed preparation, not being a preparation specified in Part II of this Schedule, is not a charge to the Department.

Chloramphenicol:

Chlortetracycline:

Erythromycin:

Oxytetracycline:

Tetracycline.”

17. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 2, and substituting the following clause:

“2. (1) ‘Penicillin restriction’ means that the availability for oral use of the several forms of penicillin specified in Part II of this Schedule pursuant to any one medical prescription (inclusive of a repeat, if any) is limited to a supply sufficient—

“(a) In the case of capsules or tablets, for a period not exceeding seven days’ treatment:

“(b) In the case of oral suspensions, paediatric drops, or other preparations (other than capsules and tablets) that are specified in Part II of this Schedule, for a period not exceeding seven days’ treatment:

“Provided that where the quantity prescribed does not coincide with the volume of a standard pack (or one or more standard packs) payment shall be made for the next smallest pack (or the smallest number of standard packs); but if a smaller pack is not available payment will be made for the next largest pack to that which was prescribed:

“(c) In the case of a prescription endorsed ‘extended supply’ that is ordered for the treatment of conditions in which penicillin is regarded as the treatment of choice by authoritative medical opinion, payment may be made for the prescribed quantity necessary for the treatment of the patient over a period not exceeding three months’ treatment, if the amount supplied on any one occasion represents not more than one month’s supply.

“(2) Any topical preparation other than a preparation that is specified in Part II of this Schedule is not a charge to the Department.”

18. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the word “continuation” were omitted from the proviso to clause 3 and also from the proviso to clause 6.

19. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 4, and substituting the following clause:

“4. ‘Otolaryngological specialist’ means that the material concerned may be supplied solely on the prescription of an otolaryngological specialist (including the registrar of the appropriate department of a public hospital) for the treatment of any medical condition affecting the ear, nose, or throat:

“Provided that, in the case of treatment recommended by the otolaryngological specialist, the prescription of a medical practitioner endorsed with the words, ‘recommended by [*Name of specialist*]’ shall be accepted for payment.”*

20. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 7, and substituting the following clause:

“7. ‘Approved condition’ means supplied pursuant to a prescription endorsed with the words ‘Approved condition’ written in the practitioner’s own handwriting or signed or initialled by the practitioner, and ordered for therapeutic purposes and not for contraceptive purposes.

21. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 8, and substituting the following clause:

“8. ‘In combination’ means that the material concerned is allowed at the cost of the Department when included in a medical prescription in combination with other pharmaceutical requirements which are specified in this Schedule as being available otherwise than ‘in combination’, and then only to the extent (if any) specified.”

*This amendment was not included in the Drug Tariff 1964, Amendment No. 6.

22. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 12, and substituting the following clause:

“12. ‘Psychiatric specialist’ means that the material concerned may be supplied at the cost of the Department solely pursuant to a medical practitioner’s supply order written by a medical practitioner who is engaged in the practice of psychiatry.”

23. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 is hereby amended by revoking clause 13, and substituting the following clause:

“13. Where a quantity is specified in the availability column of Part II of this Schedule, it refers to the maximum quantity of the pharmaceutical requirement for which payment will be made on each occasion that the requirement is dispensed either on the original dispensing of the requirement or on the dispensing of a repeat (if any). The restriction of availability to ‘one pack’ or ‘one tube’ shall not apply to a medical practitioner’s supply order. Except where a prescription orders a pharmaceutical requirement to which the terms ‘antibiotic restriction’ or ‘penicillin restriction’ apply, the quantity restriction specified in the said availability column applies in respect of each occasion (including the dispensing of a repeat) that the requirement to which the restriction relates is dispensed.”

24. Part I of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the following clauses were added:

“14. ‘Dermatological specialist’ means that the material concerned may be supplied only on the prescription of a dermatological specialist:

“Provided that, where certain treatment is recommended by any such specialist, the prescription of a medical practitioner endorsed with the words ‘recommended by [*name of dermatological specialist*]’ shall be accepted for payment.

“15. If any question arises as to whether a medical practitioner is a specialist for the purposes of this Schedule, that question shall be referred to the Minister whose decision shall be final.”

25. Part II of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if the items specified in the First Schedule hereto were omitted.

26. The Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if Part II of the Schedule thereto included the medicines, drugs, and materials specified in the Second Schedule hereto, and as if they were available to the extent specified in the said Second Schedule.

27. The Drug Tariff 1964, Amendment No. 6, is hereby revoked; and the Drug Tariff 1964 shall be read as if this direction were the only amendment thereof that had ever been made.

This note is not part of the direction, but is intended to indicate its general effect.
