

### THE DRUG TARIFF 1967, AMENDMENT NO. 5

Pursuant to the Social Security Act 1964, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following direction.

- 1. **Title and commencement**—(1) This direction may be cited as the Drug Tariff 1967, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Drug Tariff 1967\* (hereinafter referred to as the Tariff).
  - (2) This direction shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1969.
- **2. Interpretation**—(1) Clause 2 of the Tariff shall be read as if the following definition were inserted after the definition of the term "licensed hospital" in subclause (1):

"'Material allowance' means the allowance specified in the column headed 'Material Allowance' in the Table of Allowances:".

- (2) Clause 2 of the Tariff shall be read further as if the following definition were inserted after the definition of the term "retail price" in subclause (1):
  - " 'Table of Allowances' means the Table of Allowances on Specified Proprietary Products in the Prescription Pricing Schedules:".
- (3) Clause 2 of the Tariff shall be read further as if the following definition were inserted after the definition of the term "proprietary preparation" in subclause (1):

"'Registered nurse' means a registered nurse within the meaning of the Nurses and Midwives Act 1945."

3. Scope of Tariff—Clause 3 of the Tariff shall be read as if, after the word "purposes:", the following proviso were inserted:

"Provided that preparations which have not been manufactured by

the contractor claiming payment shall be included in this Tariff and shall be deemed to be pharmaceutical requirements for its purposes only if they have been manufactured by a manufacturer named in Part III of the Schedule to this Tariff:".

4. Discounts—Clause 11 of the Tariff shall be read as if the following proviso were added to subclause (1):

"Provided that if any uncompounded preparation supplied pursuant to a prescription is specified in the Table of Allowances, any discount computed for the purposes of this clause shall be computed on the material allowance, where that is in excess of \$2.50 exclusive of dispensing fee and average container charge, in each case as if the material allowance were the retail price, but in no case shall that discount reduce the material allowance of an ingredient below \$2.50."

5. Bulk supply orders and medical practitioners supply orders—Clause 16 of the Tariff shall be read as if subclause (2) were revoked and the following subclauses were substituted:

"(2) Before any discount provided for in this Tariff is deducted, there shall be deducted from the total price of any supply order, computed in accordance with subclause (1) of this clause, a special discount of 10 percent:

"Provided that the special discount of 10 percent shall not be deducted in the case of allergy treatment sets, insulin preparations, or radiographic

preparatory substances."

6. Provision for payment of anaesthetic gases—The Tariff shall be read as if the following clause were inserted after clause 24:

"24A. Payment to a medical practitioner in respect of a gas specified in the Schedule to this Tariff shall be at the rate of \$0.60 for each occasion when an anaesthetic is administered containing that gas:

"Provided that if an anaesthetic contains more than one gas specified in the Schedule to this Tariff payment shall be made in respect only of one gas contained in that anaesthetic as if that one gas and no other gas were used on that occasion."

- 7. Period and quantity of supply of certain antibiotics, etc.— The Tariff shall be read as if clause 25 were revoked, and the following clause were substituted:
- **"25. Period and quantity of supply—**(1) Payment may be made pursuant to any one prescription for a quantity of the pharmaceutical requirement so prescribed sufficient to provide treatment for a period not exceeding 7 days in respect of the original supply and a further 7 days in respect of the repeat:

"Provided that, on the contractor supplying a lesser or greater quantity than that prescribed and endorsing the prescription accordingly, payment

shall be made to him in respect of the amount so supplied-

"(a) If the quantity prescribed does not coincide with the volume of a standard container and the amount contained in the nearest

next largest standard size container is supplied; or

- "(b) If the quantity prescribed does not coincide with an original pack and the requirement is packed in a collapsible tube, dropper bottle, or other special container from which it is not practicable to dispense the exact quantity.
- "(2) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in subclause (1) of this clause, where any prescription prescribes any pharmaceutical requirement to which the restriction 'antibiotic restriction' applies, payment may only be made in respect of that prescription (which may provide for a repeat) to the extent that it prescribes sufficient of the requirement to provide a person with treatment for a period not exceeding 7 days.
- "(3) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (a) of the proviso to subclause (1) of this clause, in any case where the liquid oral form of a pharmaceutical requirement is prescribed, and either the restriction 'antibiotic restriction' or 'penicillin restriction' applies, payment shall be made for-
  - "(a) The exact numerical proportion of the bulk pack if such a pack is available; or
  - "(b) The next smallest pack or the next smallest number of packs, as the case may be, if the quantity prescribed does not coincide with a standard pack and a bulk pack is not available; or

"(c) The next largest pack if the quantity prescribed does not coincide with a standard pack and neither a bulk pack nor a smaller pack is available:

"Provided that, in any case where the pharmaceutical requirement is ordered as an injection and the restriction 'antibiotic restriction' applies, payment may only be made for a quantity sufficient for a period not

exceeding 72 hours' treatment.

"(4) Notwithstanding anything in subclause (1) or subclause (3) of this clause, where a quantity is specified in the availability column of Part II of the Schedule to this Tariff, it refers to the maximum quantity of the pharmaceutical requirement for which payment may be made on each occasion that the requirement is dispensed, either on the original dispensing of the requirement or on the dispensing of any repeat. The restriction of availability to 'one pack' or 'one tube' shall not apply to a

medical practitioner's supply order or to a bulk supply order.

"(5) Notwithstanding anything in subclauses (1) to (4) of this clause, where, in the opinion of the prescribing medical practitioner, extended treatment is necessary for a period of not less than 1 month and no danger is involved in the use of a pharmaceutical requirement without medical supervision, a supply of that pharmaceutical requirement not exceeding a quantity sufficient to provide that person with treatment for a specified period of 1 month in the case of a narcotic or from 1 to 3 months in any other case may be made on any one prescription; and, if the medical practitioner has endorsed the prescription with the words 'extended supply' and has specified on it the period for which that pharmaceutical requirement is to be supplied, payment shall be made in respect of a claim made accordingly:

"Provided that in any case where a patient is receiving an extended supply of any pharmaceutical requirement, that requirement shall be

dispensed in monthly lots, unless-

(a) The prescriber makes a special endorsement on the prescription stating the period for which each lot is to be dispensed; or

"(b) The contractor or the patient endorses the back of the prescription with a statement of the special reasons why a quantity greater or less than a monthly lot is required to be dispensed:

"Provided also that, in the case of a pharmaceutical requirement in respect of which the restriction 'antibiotic restriction' or 'penicillin restriction' applies, no more than 1 month's supply shall be dispensed at any one time.

"(6) Any prescription that is not presented to a contractor for dispensing within 4 days of its being written in the case of a narcotic, or within 3 months of its being written in any other case, shall cease to be a charge to

the Department.

"(7) A repeat on a prescription that remains unfulfilled after 1 month from the date of first dispensing of any requirement named in the prescription shall cease to be a charge to the Department. The contractor concerned may submit a claim for part fulfilment of the total quantity ordered in respect of the part that is due for payment.

"(8) A repeat on a prescription endorsed 'extended supply' that remains unfulfilled after 3 months from the date of first dispensing of any requirement named in the prescription shall cease to be a charge to the Department. The contractor concerned may submit a claim for the part fulfillment of the total quantity ordered in respect of the part

that is due for payment, and payment shall be made accordingly."

**8. Bulk supply orders**—Clause 26 of the Tariff shall be read as if subclause (1) were revoked and the following subclause were substituted:

"(1) Notwithstanding anything in this Tariff, the licensee or manager of a licensed hospital or the matron or other person in charge of an institution approved by the Director-General may obtain, pursuant to a bulk supply order on a form to be supplied by the Department, such pharmaceutical requirements as he expects will be required for the treatment of persons who are under medical supervision in that hospital or approved institution:

"Provided that-

- "(a) Payment shall not be made for any requirement that is specifically restricted in the Schedule to this Tariff:
- "(b) The licensee or manager or, as the case may be, the matron or other person may be called upon to justify the amount ordered:
- "(c) No narcotic shall be obtained on a bulk supply order by any institution which is not a licensed hospital or which is not an institution or place recognised and approved as a hospital for the purposes of Part II of the Social Security Act 1964:
- "(d) No item listed in the Seventh Schedule to the Poisons Regulations 1964\* shall be obtained on a bulk supply order by any institution which is not a licensed hospital or which is not an institution or place recognised and approved as a hospital for the purposes of Part II of the Social Security Act 1964, unless— (i) A registered nurse is employed by the institution; and

"(ii) The order is supported by a written requisition signed by a medical practitioner."

9. Payment in respect of medical practitioners' supply orders— Clause 27 of the Tariff shall be read as if paragraph (c) of subclause (2) were revoked, and the following paragraph were substituted:

"(c) Sets out the pharmaceutical requirements (not being requirements that may only be supplied by a Hospital Board) that the medical practitioner requires at the time:".

10. Definition of "Hospital Board-specialist" in Part I of Schedule to Tariff—Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read

as if clause 5 were revoked, and the following were substituted:

"5. 'Hospital Board—specialist' means that the pharmaceutical requirement concerned may be supplied free of charge only by a Hospital Board to any person who is not an inpatient of a public hospital on the prescription of a specialist. Where treatment of any such person with the requirement has been recommended by a specialist and the requirement is prescribed by a medical practitioner, the prescription of the medical practitioner endorsed with the words 'recommended by [name of specialist]' shall be accepted by a Hospital Board and the requirement shall be supplied as aforesaid.

"For the purposes of this definition it shall not make any difference whether the specialist is employed by the Board or not."

11. Antibiotic restriction—Clause 1 of Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if subclause (2) were revoked, and the following subclause were substituted:

- "(2) Any proprietary topical application of an antibiotic (other than a preparation that is specified in Part II of this Schedule) shall not be a charge to the Department. Where any quantity of any pharmaceutical requirement specified in this subclause, or its salts or derivatives, is present in any preparation compounded by a contractor, not being a preparation specified in Part II of this Schedule, it shall not be a charge to the Department. The requirements so specified are chloramphenicol, chlortetracycline, erythromycin, oxytetracycline, and tetracycline."
- **12. Penicillin restriction**—Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if clause 12 were revoked, and the following clause were substituted:
- "12. (1) 'Penicillin restriction' means the supply of penicillin in accordance with clause 25 of this Tariff; but in the case of a prescription for penicillin which is endorsed 'extended supply', payment may be made only when the penicillin is used in the treatment of conditions in which it is regarded as the treatment of choice by authoritative medical opinion.
- "(2) Any topical preparation of penicillin other than a preparation that is specified in Part II of this Schedule shall not be a charge to the Department."
- 13. Definition of "anaesthetic gases"—Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if clause 13 were revoked, and the following clause were substituted:
- "13. Anaesthetic gases' means that payment will be made to a medical practitioner who has administered the gas to a person who is neither an inpatient of a public hospital nor a person for whom the anaesthetic service has been provided as part of a maternity benefit, if the amount specified in clause 24A has been credited to that person's account."
- 14. Definition of "Hospital Board—O. and G. specialist" added to Part I of Schedule to Tariff—Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if the following clause were added:
- "15. 'Hospital Board—O. and G. specialist' means that the pharmaceutical requirement concerned may be supplied free of charge only by a Hospital Board to any person who is not an inpatient of a public hospital on the prescription of an obstetrical or gynaecological specialist."
- 15. Certain pharmaceutical requirements omitted from Part II of Schedule to Tariff—Part II of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if the pharmaceutical requirements specified in the First Schedule to this direction were omitted.
- 16. Certain pharmaceutical requirements added to Part II of Schedule to Tariff—Part II of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if it included the pharmaceutical requirements specified in the Second Schedule to this direction and as if those requirements were available to the extent specified in that Schedule.
- 17. New Part III of Schedule to Tariff—The Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if the Third Schedule to this direction were Part III of the Schedule to the Tariff.
- 18. Revocation—The Drug Tariff 1967, Amendment No. 4, is hereby revoked; and the Drug Tariff 1967 shall be read as if this direction were the only amendment of the Tariff that had ever been made.
