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THE DRUG TARIFF 1981, AMENDMENT NO. 9

PURSUANT to section 99 of the Social Security Act 1964, the Minister of Health hereby gives the following direction.

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DIRECTION

1. Title and commencement—(1) This direction may be cited as the Drug Tariff 1981, Amendment No. 9, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Drug Tariff 1981* (hereinafter referred to as the Tariff).

(2) This direction shall come into force on the 1st day of April 1984. (3) For the purpose of applying the Tariff after the commencement of this direction, but without affecting the validity or consequences of anything that has been done before the commencement of this direction, the Tariff shall have effect as if this amendment were the only amendment to the Tariff that had ever been made.

2. Scope of direction—Clause 3 (2) of the Tariff shall be read as if the following paragraphs were added:

"(o) Lubricating jellies and catheter lubricants:

- "(p) Sterile diluents for nebulising solutions:
- "(q) Unless it is specified in Part II of the Schedule to this direction that they be in such a form, substances for transdermal delivery."

3. Prices for pharmaceutical requirements—(1) Clause 5 (6) of the Tariff shall be read as if, for the expression "10", there were substituted the expression "15".

(2) Clause 5(7) of the Tariff shall be read as if, for the expression "25", there were substituted the expression "35".

4. Prescription pricing—(1) Clause 7 of the Tariff shall be read as if, for paragraph (b), there were substituted the following paragraph:

"(b) The amount specified in the Second Schedule to the Prescription Pricing Schedules for—

"(i) The average container charge; and

"(ii) An approved child resistant closure, if the pharmaceutical

requirement is dispensed in a container having such a closure:". (2) The said clause 7 shall be read as if there were added the following paragraph:

"(d) In the case only of a Class B controlled drug that, at the time of initial dispensing could not be supplied in the total quantity of the initial supply prescribed, the appropriate additional fee set out in the Third Schedule to the Prescription Pricing Schedules."

5. Water—Clause 15 of the Tariff shall be read as if subclause (2) were revoked.

6. New clauses substituted—The Tariff shall be read as if clause 16 were revoked, and the following clauses were substituted:

"16A. **Payment for bulk supply orders**—(1) Subject to subclauses (2) and (3) of this clause, there shall be made for items supplied on bulk supply orders the following payments:

- "(a) For items (other than insulin preparations) listed in the Prescription Pricing Schedules, the selling price, plus 17.37 percent:
- "(b) For items (other than insulin preparations) not so listed, the price charged to the contractor, plus 30.63 percent:
- "(c) For insulin preparations, the price charged to the contractor, plus 20 percent.

"(2) No payment shall be made for containers supplied with items ordered on a bulk supply order.

"(3) Subject to subclause (4) of this clause, no payment shall be made for a professional fee in respect of items so ordered.

"(4) There shall be payable in respect of items so ordered compounded by the contractor the fee specified in the Third Schedule to the Prescription Pricing Schedules, less 10 percent.

"16B. **Payment for practitioners' supply orders**—(1) There shall be made for items supplied on practitioners' supply orders the following payments:

"(a) The total selling price of those items:

- "(b) Every time a professional fee is paid in respect of any such item, the average container charge specified in the Second Schedule to the Prescription Pricing Schedules:
- "(c) The appropriate professional fee as set out in the Prescription Pricing Schedules.

"(2) For the purposes of subclause (1) (c) of this clause, the appropriate professional fee in respect of any item dispensed shall be—

- "(a) For oral contraceptives, and all other items dispensed by count in packs of sizes listed in the column headed 'Prescription Wholesale Price' in the First Schedule to the Prescription Pricing Schedules, the class I professional fee specified in those Schedules, in respect of each dispensing of the item concerned regardless of the number of such packs dispensed:
- "(b) For all items (other than oral contraceptives) dispensed by count in packs of sizes not so listed, the class I professional fee as aforesaid in respect of each such pack dispensed:
- "(c) Subject to paragraph (d) of this subclause, for items extemporaneously compounded by the contractor, the appropriate professional fee specified in the Third Schedule to those Schedules:
- "(d) For multiple packs of items extemporaneously compounded by the contractor on a single occasion, the appropriate professional fee as aforesaid for the first pack, and the class I professional fee as aforesaid for each additional pack dispensed with it."

7. Claims on Department—Clause 18 of the Tariff shall be read as if, for subclause (2), there were substituted the following subclause:

"(2) Where the claim relates to or includes any prescription or order that was last dispensed more than 3 months before the date on which the claim is first received by the Department, the amount due to the contractor in respect of every such prescription or order so dispensed shall, unless the contractor satisfies the Department that he has a reasonable excuse for his delay in submitting the claim, and subject to any general or special directions given by the Director-General, be reduced by a discount of 20 percent:

"Provided that the amount due shall not be reduced by the said discount in any case where a prescription specifies that requirements are to be supplied for a period not exceeding 3 months and is fulfilled in part only and is received by the Department for payment within 6 months of the date of initial dispensing, or within 9 months in the case of a prescription form including an oral contraceptive."

8. Allergy treatment sets—Clause 19 of the Tariff shall be read as if subclause (3) were revoked.

9. Payment for plastic syringes—The Tariff shall be read as if, after clause 20, there were inserted the following clause:

"20A. Payment to a contractor in respect of plastic syringes allowed under the Schedule to this direction shall be computed by adding together the cost price of the requirements, 15 percent of that cost price, the appropriate professional fee, and the average container charge."

10. Payment for anaesthetic gases—Clause 22 of the Tariff shall be read as if, for the expression "\$2.50", there were substituted the expression "\$4.00".

11. Period and quantity of supply where prescription written by medical practitioner—(1) Clause 23 of the Tariff shall be read as if, after paragraph (a), there were inserted the following paragraph:

"(aa) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this clause, where the medical practitioner prescribes a pharmaceutical requirement specified in the Schedule to this direction as being subject to 'antibiotic restriction', payment may be made for only such amount of the requirement as is sufficient to provide treatment for a period not exceeding 4 days and, where the prescription specifies a repeat, for only such further amount of the requirement as is sufficient to provide treatment for one further period not exceeding 4 days, unless the prescription is endorsed 'extended supply', and specifies in it the quantity required or the period for which treatment is required, in which case payment may be made for the actual quantity dispensed if that quantity does not exceed that necessary to provide treatment for a period of 3 months:

"Provided that where a patient is receiving an extended supply of such a requirement, that requirement shall be dispensed in monthly lots, unless—

"(i) The medical practitioner endorses the prescription with a statement of the period for which each lot is to be dispensed; or

"(ii) The contractor or the patient endorses the back of the prescription with a statement of the special reasons why a greater quantity is required to be dispensed:".

(2) Paragraph (d) of the said clause 23 shall be read as if, for the expression "4", there were substituted the expression "7".

12. Period and quantity of supply where prescription written by dentist—(1) Clause 25 of the Tariff shall be read as if, after paragraph (a), there were inserted the following paragraph:

"(aa) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this clause, where the dentist prescribes a pharmaceutical requirement specified in the Schedule to this direction as being subject to 'antibiotic restriction', payment may be made for only such amount of the requirement as is sufficient to provide treatment for a period not exceeding 4 days and, where the prescription specifies a repeat, for only such further amount of the requirement as is sufficient to provide treatment for one further period not exceeding 4 days:".

(2) Paragraph (c) of the said clause 25 shall be read as if, for the expression "4", there were substituted the expression "7".

18. Original packs, and certain antibiotics—The Tariff shall be read as if for clause 26, there were substituted the following clause:

"26. (1) Notwithstanding clauses 23 and 25 of this direction, if a practitioner orders a pharmaceutical requirement that is packed in collapsible tubes, dropper bottles, or other special containers from which it is not practicable to dispense lesser amounts, every reference in those clauses to an amount for which payment may be made shall be deemed to be a reference—

"(a) Where an amount of the requirement is specified in the prescription, to the smallest amount sufficient to provide the amount specified that it is practicable to dispense; and

"(b) In every other case, to the amount contained in the smallest container of the requirement that is manufactured in or imported into New Zealand.

"(2) If a practitioner orders, in an amount that does not coincide with the amount of a standard pack or any number of standard packs of the requirement, the liquid oral form of an antibiotic that requires the addition of a diluent at the time of dispensing, payment may be made for a standard 1984/36

pack or a combination of standard packs (instead of for the quantity prescribed in accordance with clause 23 or clause 25 of this direction, as the case may be) only if the contractor satisfies the Department that he has not been able to dispense the balance of that pack or of those packs."

14. Practitioner's supply orders—(1) Clause 28 of the Tariff shall be read as if, for subclause (1), there were substituted the following subclause:

"(1) Notwithstanding anything in this direction, a practitioner may obtain, pursuant to a practitioner's supply order, such pharmaceutical requirements as he expects to be required for personal administration to patients under his care, if the quantities ordered are reasonable for up to 1 month's supply in the conditions obtaining in his practice; but no payment will be made for any pharmaceutical requirement that is specifically restricted in the Schedule to this direction. The practitioner may be called upon to justify the amounts ordered."

(2) Clause (2) of the said clause 28 shall be read as if paragraph (e) were omitted.

15. Definition of "Antibiotic restriction"—Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if, after clause 1, there were inserted the following clause:

"1A. 'Antibiotic restriction' means that payment for prescriptions for oral forms of the pharmaceutical requirement may be made only in accordance with clause 23 (aa) or clause 25 (aa) of this direction (as the case requires)."

16. Definition of "Diabetic syringes"—Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if, after clause 3, there were inserted the following clause:

"3A. 'Diabetic syringes' means that payment may be made for up to 13 plastic syringes with attached needles as a single supply if the prescription is written on the same prescription form as a prescription for 3 months supply of insulin, or as a single supply, for up to 1 plastic syringe with attached needle for every week's supply of insulin prescribed if the prescription for insulin calls for less than 3 months supply."

17. Definition of "Hospital Pharmacy-dermatologist"—Part I of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if, after clause 4, there were inserted the following clause:

"4A. 'Hospital Pharmacy—dermatologist' means that the pharmaceutical requirement concerned may be supplied free of charge only by a Hospital Board to a person who is not an inpatient of any public hospital under the control of that Board, and on the prescription of a specialist in dermatology."

18. Certain pharmaceutical requirements deleted from Part II of Schedule to Tariff—Part II of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if the pharmaceutical requirements specified in the First Schedule to this direction were deleted.

19. Certain pharmaceutical requirements added to Part II of Schedule to Tariff—Part II of the Schedule to the Tariff shall be read as if it included the pharmaceutical requirements specified in the Second Schedule to this direction and as if those requirements were available to the extent specified in that Schedule. 20. Revocation—The Drug Tariff 1981, Amendment No. 8* is hereby revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the direction, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This direction makes 4 amendments to the Drug Tariff 1981. First, it provides a new system of reimbursement to retail pharmacists for pharmaceutical requirements obtained on a practitioner's supply order form.

Secondly, it increases the amount paid for oxygen and nitrous oxide used in anaesthetic procedures from \$2.50 to \$4.00.

Thirdly, practitioners and their agents are no longer required to sign for the receipt of pharmaceutical requirements obtained on a practitioners' supply order form. Fourthly, the direction provides for deletions from and additions to the list of pharmaceutical

Fourthly, the direction provides for deletions from and additions to the list of pharmaceutical requirements in Part II of the Schedule to the Drug Tariff 1981. Deleted items do not in all cases disappear from the list, as they are sometimes added again in a varied form. Some of the items added are:
