#### Rules

#### 1 Title

- (1) These rules are the Domestic Violence Amendment Rules (No 2) 2002.
- (2) In these rules, the Domestic Violence Rules 1996 are called "the principal rules".

#### 2 Commencement

These rules come into force on 21 October 2002.

### 3 Application

Rule 2(2) of the principal rules is amended by inserting, after paragraph (a), the following paragraph:

- "(aa) proceedings under the Act to which the Family Courts Rules 2002 apply, namely—
  - "(i) proceedings in a Family Court; and
  - "(ii) proceedings in a District Court acting under section 15 of the Family Courts Act 1980; or".

## 4 Procedure on transfer of proceedings

Rule 81(3) of the principal rules is revoked.

# 5 Registration of foreign protection orders

Rule 91(a) of the principal rules is amended by omitting the words "the Family Court which is a division of".

# **Explanatory note**

This note is not part of the rules, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These rules, which come into force on 21 October 2002, amend the Domestic Violence Rules 1996 to—

- make it clear that those rules do not apply to proceedings to which the Family Courts Rules 2002 apply; and
- remove provisions that relate solely to the jurisdiction of Family Courts under the Domestic Violence Act 1995.
