

THE EXAMINATION AND CERTIFICATION OF TEACHERS REGULATIONS 1961, AMENDMENT NO. 2

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Examination and Certification of Teachers Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Examination and Certification of Teachers Regulations 1961* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 4 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by

revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:

"(1) Every candidate for a teacher's certificate shall be required to submit evidence of having passed either an examination in accordance with these regulations or an equivalent examination held by—

"(a) Some sufficient public authority; or

"(b) Any other authority approved by the Minister for the purpose."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations rewrite subclause (1) of regulation 4 of the principal regulations so as to provide for recognition of an equivalent examination held by any authority approved by the Minister for the purpose as well as one approved by some sufficient public authority.
