**ORDER IN COUNCIL**

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

**REGULATIONS**

1. These regulations may be cited as the Examination and Certification of Teachers Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 5, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Examination and Certification of Teachers Regulations 1961\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from Part II and also from Part III of the Schedule of subjects for the Trained Teachers Certificate Examination the words "(including Needlework for women)".

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.*

These regulations provide for the omission of the requirement of needlework for women in the subject of Art and Crafts as prescribed in Parts II and III of the schedule of examination subjects.
