PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Examination and Certification of Teachers Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 8, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Examination and Certification of Teachers Regulations 1961* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the day after the date of their notification in the *Gazette*.

2. Conditions of entry—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation 15, and substituting the following regulation:

“15. (1) No person shall in any year be entitled to be a candidate for the first time for the Trained Teachers Certificate Examination unless, on making application on the form provided by the Director-General, he has been accepted by the Director-General as a candidate for the examination; and every application in any year to be accepted as a candidate for the examination for the first time shall, except in special circumstances where the Director-General otherwise approves, be forwarded so as to reach the Director-General not later than the 1st day of March of that year.

“(2) The Director-General shall not accept any person as a candidate for the first time for the Trained Teachers Certificate Examination unless he is satisfied that the person—

- “(a) Is residing in New Zealand and is entitled to continue to reside there permanently; and
- “(b) Has the educational qualifications required for entry to a State teachers college or such other qualifications as are, in the opinion of the Director-General, adequate for entry to the courses and examinations for the Trained Teachers Certificate and for entry to the teaching service; and
- “(c) Meets the requirements of regulation 13 (4) of the Teachers Training College Regulations 1959 for admission to a State teachers college; and
- “(d) Is unable to attend a State teachers college for any adequate reason; and
- “(e) Is teaching in New Zealand, or holds some other position in a school in New Zealand that will provide adequate experience for the purposes of subclause (3) (a) of this regulation, or is enrolled in a private teachers college recognised by the Director-General; and
- “(f) Has completed a declaration of intention to teach in a school in New Zealand for a period of 4 years, comprising 2 years to meet the requirements for certification as a teacher and 2 years thereafter.

“(3) No candidate shall be entitled in any year to sit any subject of the Trained Teachers Certificate Examination unless the Director-General is satisfied that in that year the candidate—

- “(a) Has satisfactorily completed a tutorial course in the subject conducted by the Correspondence School or a course approved by the Director-General as equivalent thereto; and
- “(b) Has continued either to hold a position to which subclause 2 (e) of this regulation applies or to be enrolled in a private teachers college recognised by the Director-General.

“(4) Every candidate shall apply to enter for the examination on the form provided by the Director-General and, except in special circumstances where the Director-General otherwise approves, no entry shall be accepted unless the completed form, indicating the subjects in which the candidate wishes to be examined and in which he wishes to enrol in a tutorial course in order to meet the requirements of subclause (3) of this regulation, is received by the Principal of the Correspondence School, Department of Education, Wellington, not later than the 1st day of March in the year to which the entry relates.

“(5) The form of application for entry to the examination shall be accompanied by an examination fee of \$3 for each subject.”

(2) Regulation 6 of the Examination and Certification of Teachers Regulations 1961, Amendment No. 7 is hereby consequentially revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations add to the principal regulations further requirements that a person must satisfy before becoming a candidate in the Trained Teachers Certificate Examination.
