### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 26th day of March 1962

#### Present:

THE HON. J. R. MARSHALL PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (Terms and Holidays) Regulations 1954, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Terms and Holidays) Regulations 1954\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking regulation

6, and substituting the following regulation:

"6. The Director may, on the application of an Education Board or of a governing body of a secondary school, technical school, or combined school, approve of a variation of the requirements of these regulations in respect of any school or schools under the control of the Education Board or the governing body where, in his opinion, there are special circumstances which make such variation necessary in the interests of the work of the school or schools, or where climatic or other special conditions existing in any education district or part of a district make such a course desirable."

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations extend the power of the Director of Education to authorise variations of the prescribed terms and holidays.
