PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

- 1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Education (Terms and Holidays) Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 2, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Terms and Holidays) Regulations 1984* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations.)
- (2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of January 1989.

2. Minimum length of primary school year—Regulation 3 (2) of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 2 of the Education (Terms and Holidays) Regulations 1984, Amendment No. 1) is hereby amended by omitting the expression "396" and substituting the expression "394".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

The Education (Terms and Holidays) Regulations 1984 require State primary schools to be open for 400 half-days each year, but empower the Minister of Education to reduce that period to a period of not less than 396 half-days. These regulations, which come into force on 1 January 1989, have the effect of allowing the Minister to reduce the period to a period of not less than 394 half-days.
