THE EXPLOSIVES AUTHORISATION ORDER 1959, AMENDMENT NO. 1

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Explosives Act 1957, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order.

ORDER

1. Title and commencement—(1) This order may be cited as the Explosives Authorisation Order 1959, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Explosives Authorisation Order 1959* (hereinafter referred to as the principal order).

(2) This order shall come into force on the day after the date of its notification in the Gazette.

2. Package for certain explosives-The principal order is hereby amended by inserting, after clause 6, the following clause:

"6A. Notwithstanding anything in clause 6 of this order, where---

- "(a) Any authorised blasting explosive of class 2, or class 3, or class 4 in which ammonium nitrate, sodium nitrate, or sodium chloride is used as an ingredient; or
- "(b) Any authorised blasting explosive of class 3 in which nitroglycol is used as an ingredient-

is designed as a free-flowing explosive, it shall be sufficient compliance with that clause if the inner package required by regulation 64 of the Explosives Regulations 1959[†] is made thoroughly waterproof in such a manner as will prevent ingress of atmospheric moisture."

3. Authorised explosives—The Second Schedule to the principal order is hereby amended by omitting from the part thereof relating to explosives of Class 2: Nitrate Mixture the word "Nil", and substituting the words "Ammonium-nitrate explosive mixture (ZZ)".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect. Clause 2 modifies the provisions of the principal order as to wrappers or cases for certain classes of explosives.

Clause 3 adds ammonium-nitrate explosive mixture to the list of authorised explosives.
