ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government Buildings at Wellington this 6th day of April 1970

Present:

THE RIGHT HON. KEITH HOLYOAKE, C.H., PRESIDING IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 10, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

2. Removal expenses—Regulation 16 of the principal regulations, as amended by regulation 2 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 3, is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:

“(2) If a teacher is appointed on promotion to another permanent position in the Education service, he shall be entitled to payment of the actual and reasonable expenses of his removal to the position.”

3. Substitution of Schedule—(1) The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Eighth Schedule, as substituted by regulation 13 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 8, and substituting the Eighth Schedule set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

(2) Regulation 13 of, and the Second Schedule to, the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 8 are hereby consequentially revoked.

4. Full-time relieving assistants—Regulation 57 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking paragraph (a) of subclause (1), and substituting the following paragraph:

“(a) To take the place of a full-time permanent assistant who is given leave of absence in any case where the Principal is able to certify that, without the appointment of the relieving assistant, the work undertaken by the absent permanent assistant could not be adequately undertaken and that the relieving assistant is competent to do that work:

“Provided that a relieving assistant shall not be so appointed for 1 day only unless the Principal is also able to certify that, because of shortage of staff, the employment of the relieving assistant for that 1 day is essential.”

*Scale IV (Maximum 3rd Subdivision)—except where the Director-General, on being satisfied that the teacher has academic or other qualifications, determines that a higher maximum within the scale shall be payable.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations amend the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957. The limitation of 3 years' service required by teachers before being eligible for removal expenses on promotion to another permanent position, is now dropped. The maximum limit of \$240 for those expenses in respect of household furniture and effects is removed. The conditions of employment of full-time relieving assistant teachers are amended to enable appointments to be made for a day, if employment of a relieving assistant teacher for that day is essential. A new Schedule is substituted for the existing Eighth Schedule to the principal regulations.
