## THE EDUCATION (SALARIES AND STAFFING) REGULATIONS 1957, AMENDMENT NO. 11

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 14th day of August 1972

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. Title—These regulations may be cited as the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 11, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- **2. Interpretation**—Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from the definition of the expression "probationary assistant" the word "means", and substituting the words "or 'probationary teacher' means".
- 3. Classification of schools—Regulation 20 of the principal regulations (as amended by regulation 3 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 8, and regulation 2 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 9) is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:
- "(2) Every full primary school or contributing school shall be classified, according to its grading roll, in the grade specified in the Third Schedule to these regulations; every intermediate school or intermediate department shall be so classified in the grade specified in the Fourth Schedule to

these regulations; and every secondary department of a district high school shall be so classified in the grade specified in the Seventh Schedule to these regulations."

- **4. Staffing of schools**—The principal regulations (as amended by regulation 4 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 8) are hereby further amended by revoking regulation 27, and substituting the following regulation:
- "27. (1) Except as otherwise provided in regulation 28 of these regulations, and subject to subclause (2) of this regulation, the Board or controlling authority shall, as soon as may be practicable after the grading of a school or department has been determined for any year under the provisions of regulation 21 of these regulations, determine the number of teachers to be appointed to that school or department in accordance with its grading roll as set out in the appropriate Schedule to these regulations for the type of school or department as follows:

Number of Schedule	Type of School or Department to Which Schedule Applies								
Third Schedule	 Full primary schools and contributing schools.								
Fourth Schedule	 Intermediate schools and departments.								
Sixth Schedule Seventh Schedule	 Maori schools. Secondary departments of district high schools.								

- "(2) The Director-General shall, in the case of each school, determine whether the school shall be staffed in accordance with Part A or Part B of the appropriate Schedule to these regulations.
- "(3) The special teachers to be appointed by a Board or controlling authority to an intermediate school or intermediate department in accordance with the Fourth Schedule to these regulations shall be teachers in manual training, home economics, art and crafts, and such other subjects as the Board or controlling authority, with the approval of the Director-General, may determine."
- 5. Variation of staffing entitlement—Regulation 28 of the principal regulations (as substituted by regulation 5 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 8) is hereby further amended by revoking subclause (1), and substituting the following subclause:
- "(1) The Board or controlling authority may vary the staffing entitlement of any school or department from what is prescribed in the Third and Fourth Schedule to these regulations, if the Senior Inspector considers such a course desirable after having regard to the interests of the school or department, the existing range of accommodation and the relative availability of probationary teachers and certificated teachers. Every such variation shall provide for an increase or reduction in the number of probationary teachers, and an equivalent increase or reduction in the number of classroom teachers".

- 6. Substitution of certain Schedules—The principal regulations are hereby further amended by revoking the Third Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 9), the Fourth and Fifth Schedules (as substituted by regulation 12 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 8) and the Eighth Schedule (as substituted by regulation 3 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 10), and substituting the Third and Fourth Schedules set out in the Schedule to these regulations.
- **7. Revocations**—The following regulations are hereby consequentially revoked:
  - (a) Regulations 3 to 5 of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 8:
  - (b) The Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 9:
  - (c) Regulation 3 of, and the Schedule to, the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 10.
