## THE EDUCATION (SALARIES AND STAFFING) REGULATIONS 1957, AMENDMENT NO. 1

# COBHAM, Governor-General ORDER IN COUNCIL

At the Government House at Wellington this 27th day of July 1960

#### Present:

HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

Pursuant to the Education Act 1914, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

#### REGULATIONS

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 1, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957\* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).
- 2. Regulation 2 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by inserting, after the definition of the term "scale salary", the following definition:
  - "'School of Pharmacy' means the School of Pharmacy established as a department of the technical school under the control of the Hutt Valley Technical School Board, Petone:".
- 3. Regulation 11 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting the word "Minister" in each place where it appears, and substituting in each case the words "Board or controlling authority of the school".
- **4.** Regulation 13 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2).

5. Regulation 14 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (4), and substituting the following subclause:

"(4) Where in the opinion of the Board there are special circumstances, payment may be made to a relieving teacher of a boarding allowance (or a refund of hotel or boarding expenses in place thereof) and a refund of travelling expenses, but in no case shall such payment be made for a period longer than one month without the approval of the Director."

- 6. Regulation 21 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking subclause (2), and substituting the following subclause:
- "(2) The Board may classify any school or department in a grade or subgrade lower, or (with the approval of the Senior Inspector) in a grade or subgrade higher than the grade or subgrade appropriate for its average roll, if it is satisfied that the roll number is not likely to be permanent:

"Provided that a school or department shall not be so classified in a higher grade or subgrade for a period longer than one year without the approval of the Director, unless in that period the average roll has increased so that it is appropriate to the higher grade or subgrade."

7. Regulation 29 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso:

"Provided that where any such increase occurs in the average roll number of a school, the Board may, with the approval of the Senior Inspector, add an assistant to the staff of the school at any time before the expiry of the period of four consecutive weeks, if—

- "(a) The Board and the Senior Inspector are satisfied that the increase is a permanent one; and
- "(b) The appointment is made on a relieving basis until increase in the average roll number of the school has been maintained for four consecutive weeks; and
- "(c) Teaching accommodation is available for such an appointment."
- **8.** Regulation 36 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by omitting from subclause (5) the words "Grade VIB (b)", and substituting the words "Grade VIA (b)".
- **9.** Regulation 38 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by revoking the proviso thereto.
- **10.** Regulation 54 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following proviso:

"Provided that where part-time assistants are appointed in the School of Pharmacy to give instruction which would otherwise be given by full-time assistants appointed to positions in that School, the total number of class contact hours of those part-time assistants shall not exceed the number of such hours in which instruction would have been given if full-time assistants had been appointed for the purpose."

11. The principal regulations are hereby amended by inserting, after regulation 59, the following heading and regulation:

### "Staff of School of Pharmacy

- 59A. (1) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the foregoing provisions of this Part of these regulations, the staff of the School of Pharmacy shall be determined by the Minister from time to time.
- (2) Except as provided in subclause (1) of this regulation, the staff of the technical school under the control of the Hutt Valley Technical School Board, Petone, shall be determined in accordance with the provisions of regulations 50 to 59 of these regulations as if the School

of Pharmacy were not part of that school; and the staff so determined shall be additional to that determined in accordance with subclause (1) of this regulation."

- 12. Regulation 60 of the principal regulations is hereby amended by adding the following subclause:
- "(5) Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this regulation, the following provisions shall apply in the case of the termination of the employment of teachers appointed to permanent and temporary positions in the School of Pharmacy:
  - "(a) Where a person has been appointed to a permanent position as Head, Senior Tutor, or Tutor in the School of Pharmacy, the controlling authority may terminate the employment of that person by giving him not less than three months' notice in writing, signed by the Chairman or Secretary of the controlling authority, of its intention to terminate the appointment; and, subject to the provisions of any agreement, any such person may terminate his appointment by giving to the controlling authority like notice in writing of his intention to do so:

"Provided that the termination by the controlling authority of the appointment of any such person shall be subject to the right of appeal conferred by section 149 of the Act.

- "(b) Where a person has been appointed to a temporary position in the School of Pharmacy, being a position in that School for a stated period of not more than one nor more than three years, such appointment shall be terminable only at the end of the stated period, except where the controlling authority and the person so appointed mutually agree otherwise."
- 13. The principal regulations are hereby amended by revoking the Schedules thereto, and substituting the Schedules set out in the Schedule to these regulations.

#### EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations make miscellaneous amendments to the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957. The main changes are new provisions governing the School of Pharmacy at Petone, and the substitution of a completely new set of Schedules governing the salaries of teachers and the grading and staffing of schools.
