HIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL IN COUNCIL

PURSUANT to the Education Act 1964, His Excellency the Governor-General, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following regulations.

REGULATIONS

1. Title and commencement—(1) These regulations may be cited as the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957, Amendment No. 17, and shall be read together with and deemed part of the Education (Salaries and Staffing) Regulations 1957* (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations).

(2) These regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of February

Note— The above grading and staffing tables are determined on a ratio of 1 teacher to 35 pupils, with some exceptions below grade Vd. From grade Va upwards the number of basic grade (Scale A) positions, including positions for probationary teachers, is determined by calculating to one decimal place the numerical staffing entitlement of the school on a ratio of 1 teacher to each 31 pupils and deducting from the result the number of positions shown in the above table in salary scales B1 or higher.

Each full-time teacher is debited as 1.0 against entitlement and any residue beyond a stable visible seat of full-time teacher.

Where there is more than 1 position of responsibility on a particular salary scale in the above tables, the number of those positions is shown by the figure in parentheses. For example B2 (3) means that the school is entitled to 3 positions of responsibility on scale B2."

EXPLANATORY NOTE

This note is not part of the regulations, but is intended to indicate their general effect.

These regulations, which come into force at the commencement of the 1979 school year, lower from 29 to 26 the minimum number of pupils that entitles a full primary school to 2 teachers.
